

TO THE TRIBE IN 2022. THE TRIBE WAS OFFICIALLY STATE-RECOGNIZED IN 1984 BY THE DAVIS-STRONG ACT, WHICH ACKNOWLEDGED
THEM AS A SOVEREIGN TRIBAL NATION WITH REPRESENTATION ON THE ALABAMA INDIAN AFFAIRS COMMISSION AND AFFIRMED THEIR
PRE-STATEHOOD EXISTENCE AND RIGHT TO SOVEREIGNTY AND SELF DETERMINATION.
